- 5. Ensure that needs and risks for children are appropriately assessed and effective risk management and safety plans are in place for all.
- 6. To promote child focused and timely permanency planning for all children in care.
- 7. Ensure that children have a good understanding of their life story and are supported to reach that understanding through reliable relationships with the service and providers of therapeutic interventions.
- 8. Enable children to experience permanence through an understanding of their family history, safe relationships with family & kinship networks and a stable, good quality care experience.
- 9. To deliver a service where children are supported in their health and in their education, to optimise their achievement in line with their needs and ambitions.
- 10. Maintaining family-child contact throughout placements to the benefit of the child/children.
- 11. Completing reports are completed in a timely manner and with accuracy.
- 12. Ensuring that the local authority, children, carers and their families are prepared for any court orders or proceedings.
